The NJCRC Values

- **Build partnerships** We bring stakeholders and interested parties from all sectors to the table to optimize expertise and include all elements related to coastal resilience. These include but are not limited to land use and future development, transportation, housing, economic development, public facilities and infrastructure, natural resource protection, and historic properties and cultural resources.
- Work directly with communities We work to raise awareness, identify challenges, build support for addressing those challenges, and help implement beneficial solutions.
- Share information We promote open communication within the group and with the public. Continuous open communication creates a knowledge base that allows for leveraging other's successes and failures to improve and enhance resiliency among coastal communities.
- Inform decision-making to foster action through the development of science, tools, and data. We use common and consistent messaging to promote best practices and provide accessible education and training.

Our Current Workgroups

Resilience is the priority – The Collaborative creates applicable workgroups to provide comments on proposed rules and documents; an example is the <u>comments</u> (<u>https://bit.ly/NJCRC-202001</u>) submitted for the State of New Jersey to consider in the development of the NJ Climate Change Resilience Strategy. Current workgroups have two main focuses: 1. Providing technical assistance to our coastal communities and 2. Providing guidance on and synthesizing regional knowledge on ecological restoration and the beneficial use of dredged material. NJCRC leadership along with the full Collaborative are continuously working together to identify the next set of priority actions for the NJCRC with a focus on collaborative work spanning NJCRC partner expertise and interests.
